## **HAZ15 – Cleaning Schedule**

General cleaning is required to ensure general bacterial load is kept to a minimum. Risks from inanimate objects are limited, so long as general cleaning is performed on a regular basis.

Following EHO review August 2011, the daily cleaning log was considered not required with a small team. However, we were asked to document the daily cleaning undertaken:

## **Daily Cleaning Tasks:**

**Cooker tops:** Daily wipe with fairy liquid if used that day. More stubborn grime or on a weekly basis, Cif oven cleaner used.

**Work surfaces:** see separate hazard sheet (HAZ 9)

**Sinks and taps:** cleaned with lemon cream cleaner, rinsed and then disinfected with Detox spray as per the work surface cleaning (HAZ 9).

**Dishwasher:** cleaned daily after use. Brush off any deposits and run machine with a final hot water wash.

## Weekly Cleaning Tasks (logged):

**Brown food waste recycling bin:** we use recyclable inner liners made from potato starch in the bin and rarely these will split and contaminate the interior of the bin. Washed with detergent and water and dried.

**Fridges:** any deposits removed with detergent and water. Disinfection with Detox spray.

**Kitchen floors:** vacuum clean followed by Flash floor cleaner in water.

**Insulated boxes:** wash with soap and water. Disinfection with Detox spray.

Wheelie bins: cleaned out with flash floor cleaner after the bins emptied (every 2 weeks for domestic waste bins but weekly for the green food bins)

**Dishwasher:** included in the weekly check list as a review

**Gas cookers:** included in the weekly list as a prompt to view but cleaned after every use but some weeks may be mainly cold food so ensures a check.

## **Controls:**

- a. Weekly and monthly cleaning is maintained and logged as per attached sheet.
- b. Logs are available for inspection by customers and authorised officers.

Management of failure: where the log shows that items for cleaning have been missed, these will be attended to in a timely fashion and duly logged.
